Statute of the University of Stuttgart for the university's selection process in the bachelor's degree program in Mathematics with an academic final examination (Bachelor of Science, B.Sc.) and in the teaching degree program in Mathematics with an academic final examination (Bachelor of Arts, B.A.) (Major subject/major subject (state examination for high school teacher training))

On the basis of § 6 Paragraph 1 Sentence 2 of the Hochschulzulassungsgesetz (law on university admission) dated September 15, 2005 (GBl. p. 630), last amended by the law dated April 1, 2014 (GBl. p. 99), § 19 Paragraph 1 Sentence 10 and § 63 Paragraph 2 of the Landeshochschulgesetz (law on higher education in Baden-Württemberg) dated January 1, 2005 (GBl. p. 1), last amended by the law dated April 1, 2014 (GBl. p. 99) and on the basis of § 10 Paragraph 5 of the Hochschulvergabeordnung (regulation on the award of university places) dated January 13, 2003 (GBl. p. 63 ff.), last amended by the law dated April 1, 2014 (GBl. p. 99), the Senate of the University of Stuttgart approved the following statute on June 21, 2017.

Preamble

All terms relating to offices, statuses, job titles and professional titles in this regulation which are given in the masculine form refer to men and women in equal measure and can also be listed in the corresponding female form. This also applies to higher-education degrees, academic degrees and titles.

§ 1 Scope

The University of Stuttgart awards 90 percent of the study places in the bachelor's degree program in Mathematics (B.Sc. or state examination for high school teacher training) to candidates based on the results of the university's own selection process. The selection decision is made based on the level of suitability and the motivation of the applicant for the chosen study program and their desired profession.

§ 2 Deadlines

- (1) The application for admission for the winter semester must be submitted to the University of Stuttgart by July 15 (limitation period).



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§ 3 Proposal structure

- (1) The application must be submitted in the procedure set by the Admissions and Enrollment Regulations of the University of Stuttgart.
- (2) A copy of
 - the certificate proving a general university entrance qualification, a relevant subject-related university entrance qualification or foreign university entrance qualification recognized by the responsible government agency as being equivalent,
 - proof of vocational training (if any), practical experience or extracurricular activities must be attached to the application.
 - The university can request that the documents on which the decision on admission are based are submitted in their original copies when enrolling.

§ 4 Selection Committee

- (1) A selection committee is set up by the Faculty of Mathematics and Physics to prepare the selection decision. It is made up of three full-time academic staff. One member must be a professor. The members serve a two-year period of office and may be reelected.
- (2) After completing the tendering and award procedure, the selection committee reports to the Faculty of Mathematics and Physics about the experiences gained, and makes suggestions for the further development of the selection process.
- (3) The members of the faculty board at the Faculty of Mathematics and Physics have the right to be present at the advisory sessions of the selection committee, however they do not have voting rights.

§ 5 Selection process

- (1) Participation in the selection process is limited to those who
 - applied for a study place within the deadline and in the required form, and
 - does not participate in the tendering and award procedure as part of a quota set in advance.
- (2) The selection committee makes a decision from the applications submitted based on the selection criteria named in § 6, and creates a rank order in



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accordance with § 7. The decision on selection is made by the Rectorate based on a recommendation from the selection committee.

- (3) Admission must be refused if the documents have not been submitted in time or in full in accordance with § 3 Paragraph 2.
- (4) Otherwise, the generally applicable stipulations for the admission procedure in the Hochschulvergabeordnung and the Admissions and Enrollment Regulations of the University of Stuttgart shall remain intact.

§ 6 Selection criteria

- (1) The selection is made based on a rank order to be created in accordance with § 7 based on the following criteria:
 - the average grade of the university entrance qualification,
 - type of vocational training or professional experience which gives a special indication about the candidate's suitability for the bachelor's degree program in Mathematics (B.Sc. or state examination for high school teacher training),
 - special training, practical experience or extracurricular activities and qualifications which give a special indication about the candidate's suitability for the bachelor's degree program in Mathematics (B.Sc. or state examination for high school teacher training).

§ 7 Creating the rank order for the selection decision

- (1) The selection is based on a point total which is determined based on the following academic and other performances in the following steps:
 1. Assessing the academic performances:
 - The total number of points achieved in the Abitur certificate is divided by 28 or 30¹ (max. 30 points). The resulting number is calculated to one decimal place and is not rounded.
 - Foreign grades are converted into German grades in accordance with the guidelines of the KMK (Conference of Education Ministers).
 2. Assessing the type of vocational training or professional experience, special training, practical experience or extracurricular activities and qualifications

¹ the number on older Abitur certificates with a maximum point total of 900 is divided by 30, the number on newer Abitur certificates with a maximum point.



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Each member of the selection committee assesses the other performances separately on a scale from 0 to 5. This takes account of the following criteria in particular, providing they give a special indication about the candidate's suitability for their desired university studies:

- completed vocational training in a mathematical, scientific or technical occupation or previous professional experience which is relevant to the study program (even without having completed a training course),
- practical experience,
- extracurricular activities, e.g., prizes and awards.

Afterwards, the average of the scores assigned by the individual members is calculated to one decimal place.

- (2) The points total from Paragraph 1 No 1 (academic performances) and the points total from Paragraph 1 No 2 (other performances) are added together (max. 35 points). A rank order is created of all participants based on their respective number of points calculated using the method mentioned above.
- (3) § 16 of the Hochschulvergabeordnung applies if candidates are tied on points.

§ 8 Proportion of foreign nationals

The proportion of foreign nationals in the bachelor's degree program in Mathematics (B.Sc. or state examination for high school teacher training) is set at 8% in accordance with § 9 Paragraph 1 Sentence 1 clause 2 b) of the Hochschulvergabeordnung.

§ 9 Entry into force

This statute shall enter into force on July 1, 2017. It will first apply to the admission procedure for the 2017/18 winter semester.
